At the University campus, the Academic Guidelines agreement was concluded signed between Luther, Campion and the University of Regina, promising a time of stability. A second year of work was accomplished with respect to the three year strategic plan with the most exciting development being the planning of a *StudentsFirst!* program meant to help university students with their transition in and out of university life.

Exploring faith and service through the chaplaincy

Chaplaincy on the university campus has many components. The chaplain, Cheryl Toth, works to provide meaningful worship for the community of students and staff who gather around word and sacrament weekly. Together with a chaplaincy team of students, she also develops educational and community-building events for a wide variety of students. In the past year, student peer chaplains Logan Reiter, Patience Umereweneza, Tarryn McNaughton and Emily Berntson helped organise Bible studies, Habitat for Humanity build days, a Lenten art project, monthly Soul Creation events, monthly peer-led topical theological discussions and seasonal day-long or seasonal retreats. Seeing students develop their leadership potential and deepen their faith life is one of the truly exciting aspects of the ministry.

In the stress-filled lives of university students, the chaplain provides a listening ear, an open mind and a space to decompress and gain strength. Students in crisis often find the chaplain's office a first step in getting the help they need.

Chaplaincy also connects to the wider campus community through justice and relief events. When the earthquake- and tsunami-hit Japan, campus ministry in Luther and Campion Colleges worked together to provide a "Relief for Japan Lunch" that raised over \$1000 in three hours for the relief efforts. In addition, Luther sponsored "justice lunches" that brought students, staff and faculty from across the campus together to learn about specific issues or areas of the world. In the past year, lunches were organised to highlight the work of ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission, Level Ground (a fair trade company), Canadian Food Grains Bank, and the Roman Catholic church's Development and Peace. When we can come together because of our common desire for a better world, doors open.

Celebrating the new Infrastructure Services Agreement

On 27 May 2011, the College signed a renegotiated Infrastructure Services Agreement with the University of Regina and Campion College. The new Agreement, in effect until 30 April 2017, defines how the three institutions will share in the costs of cooperatively providing a broad range of on-campus support and services to students. Some of the areas covered under the Agreement include library access, computing services support, scholarships, physical facilities maintenance, recreational facilities and programming and a variety of other academic and personal support services. Luther will transfer approximately \$600 000 to the University of Regina during 2011-12 under the terms of this Agreement.

Renovating the campus with federal funding

In July 2009, the College signed a \$1.1 million cost-shared Agreement with the Federal Government's Knowledge Infrastructure Program (KIP) to refurbish the university campus' academic buildings. The focus of these projects was to upgrade much of the aging physical plant infrastructure, and the projects included installing fire sprinklers; upgrading the 40-year old heating, ventilation and air-conditioning systems; building grade improvements; improving insulation; completing other building envelope repairs; and improving building accessibility and security. The projects were completed by the 31 March 2011 deadline. In addition, the College completed an external audit of its work that confirmed Luther's compliance with the terms and conditions of the KIP Agreement.
