ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Luther College High School in Regina, Saskatchewan is recognized as one of the best university preparatory schools in western Canada. Graduates have gone on to Harvard, Yale, University of Toronto, Pennsylvania State, Oxford, McGill, Queen's, and other excellent educational institutions. Over 96 percent of Luther College High School graduates pursue post-secondary educations.

Luther College alumni receive international recognition. In 1983, in honour of his work in the study of mechanisms of electron transfer reactions in metal complexes, Dr. Henry Taube (HS'32, HSU'33) was awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Three Luther College High School graduates have been recipients of Rhodes Scholarships: Greg Brandt (1955), Robert Condon McKenzie (1966) and Jonathan Pedde (2010).

CURRICULUM

Luther College was founded in 1913 and today is a historic independent high school offering exceptional secondary education in grades 9 to 12. The College consists of a high school campus and a post-secondary campus federated with the University of Regina. Luther College provides a Christian context in which students learn and grow. We welcome students from all faith backgrounds and encourage them to explore the meaning of faith in their own lives. Luther students receive a strong liberal arts education that encourages critical thinking and creativity in subject areas across all disciplines, equipping them for post-secondary success.

Luther College High School exceeds the curriculum established by the Government of Saskatchewan.

Luther also offers the acclaimed International Baccalaureate (IB) program, featuring enhanced subject matter and accelerated classes. The IB program provides an enriched curriculum that both covers and extends beyond regular Saskatchewan curricula in its depth and detail. Capable, enthusiastic students in grades eleven and twelve have the opportunity to pursue the IB diploma program of studies. Students develop the organizational, time management, and study skills necessary for their success at university. Students also can gain post-secondary credits for completing IB courses.





ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

The objective of the ESL program at Luther College High School is to ensure students have the requisite English language skills needed to study at the school. The expectations at Luther College are designed to prepare students for success at the post-secondary institution of their choice. Luther College has an excellent reputation for developing students' academic skills so that they are well prepared for post-secondary studies.

Due to the strong emphasis on academics, international students coming to Luther with a credit in English from another institution may not be able to succeed in our regular English classes. The same applies to other humanities classes including History and Christian Ethics. As a result, Luther tests all international students through Skype to measure their English comprehension skills. Based on that assessment, Luther places students in the appropriate level of ESL, or mainstream classes. Students who test at the beginner level will not be accepted into Luther College. Students may reapply at a later date but must reach an intermediate level to be able to function and study at the school.

DORM LIFE

Luther College High School on-campus dormitories have room for 50 boys and 50 girls. Rooms are double occupancy and come furnished with beds, desks, and built-in closets. Safety and adult supervision are the key considerations for Luther staff. A dean of men, a dean of women and several assistant deans guide and supervise dorm students. At least one dean of men and one dean of women are always on duty. Deans serve as positive role models, rule enforcers and confidantes. A school nurse is also available to students on weekday mornings. Resident students have access to a dorm lounge and high speed wireless internet. Meals and snacks are provided in the Luther College cafeteria.

STUDENT BODY

Luther College High School attracts students from all over the world because it is dedicated to offering an unsurpassed quality of education that enriches students' lives.

Although most Luther students come from Regina and Saskatchewan, over 50 international students participate in the school community; around 12 percent of the student body.

International students are required to live at Luther, and become part of a tightly woven community of students, parents, teachers, and staff. Luther College High School affirms the significance of respecting and embracing the cultures of other people. We believe that the cultural diversity in our international student body is a rich and vital experience for all our students. Students are able to share ideas and experiences with people from a variety of backgrounds.

FACILITIES

The High School recently completed a \$17.3 million dollar expansion which includes a new performance stage, three new classrooms (two of which are dedicated to fine arts), a new gymnasium and fitness training centre, and a student commons area. The school also has renovated science labs and upgraded on-campus dorms.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Luther has a rich history of dynamic athletics, fine arts, and other co-curricular activities. Students can participate in activities as diverse as their individual interests. Participation in artistic, athletic and social activities is an essential component of a well-rounded education that seeks to develop the whole person.



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CITY OF REGINA

Luther is located in Regina, the capital of the province of Saskatchewan. Regina is growing, with a current population of 205,000 and growth expected to reach a population of 300,000 by 2040.

Luther College High School is located at 1500 Royal Street, minutes from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) Depot and Heritage Centre and historic Government House. Regina is home to the training depot for cadets of the RCMP.

Regina has one of North America's largest urban parks – even bigger than Central Park in New York! Wascana Centre, at the heart of the city, is home to the Saskatchewan Legislative Building which sits in the park on the southern shore of Wascana Lake.

Regina is the sunniest provincial capital in Canada. Regina's climate is distinguished by four distinct seasons: spring is warmer and sometimes rainy; summer is hot and usually dry; fall is moderate and typically dry; winter is cold with snow. Weather is not a major concern for international students who live in Luther's dorms because all of the buildings are connected.

TRANSPORTATION

There is an international airport with direct flights to cities such as Toronto, Calgary, Vancouver, and Minneapolis. The airport is a five minute taxi ride from Luther. Students can easily get around the city by accessing public transportation and private taxi services. Regina Transit operates the city bus service.

HEALTH CARE

Upon arriving, international students must apply for a health care card in order to receive basic health care services. Coverage is in effect according to the date on the student's visa.
