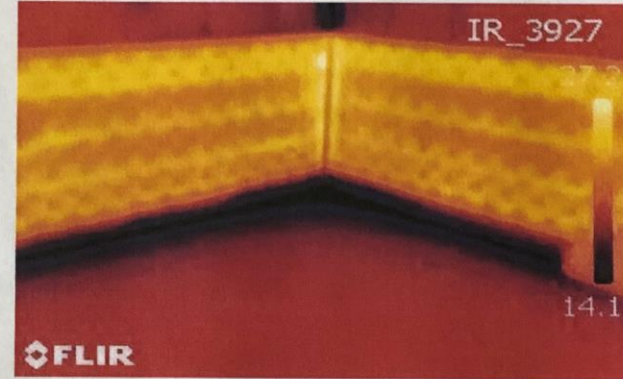


Thermal mass is the ability of a material to absorb, store and release heat under lower temperature conditions. Concrete has a unique energy saving advantage

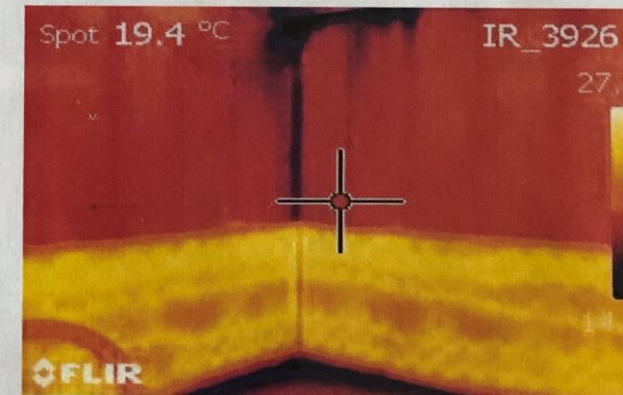
